Guidelines for Full Length Paper

The paper should be original and presented for the first time. Paper should be compiled in the following order: title page; abstract; keywords; main text introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion; acknowledgments; declaration of interest statement; references; table(s) with caption(s) (on individual pages); figures; figure captions (as a list).; The number of pages should be limited to 6; ·Use Times Roman 12 font size with 1.5-line spacing and for title 14 font size; ·Each paper will be given 10 minutes for a PowerPoint presentation.

Selected Papers / Articles will be published in Conference Proceedings with ISBN
